[PROPOSED] ORDER GRANTING PLAINTIFFS' <u>UNOPPOSED</u> MOTION FOR APPROVAL OF CLASS ACTION NOTICE PLAN	

This matter came before the Court on Plaintiffs' Unopposed Motion For Approval Of Class Action Notice Plan ("Motion"). For good cause shown, Plaintiffs' Motion is hereby **GRANTED**.

The Court hereby:

- Approves the Notice Plan outlined in the Declaration of Cameron R. Azari, Esq.;
- Appoints Epiq Class Action & Claims Solutions, Inc. as Class Administrator; and
- Enters the below schedule related to intermediate deadlines and the final approval hearing:

Event	Deadline
Notice Date	No later than 14 days after entry of approval of Class Notice Plan
Notice Period	Six weeks, beginning on the Notice Date
Defendants' First Payment to QSF for Notice Plan Costs	Within 30 days of the entry of the Class Notice Plan, in an amount to be determined by Epiq
Deadline for Settlement Class Members to Opt-Out of Settlement	30 days after end of Notice Period
Deadline for Class Members to Object to Settlement (the "Objection Deadline")	30 days after end of Notice Period
Plaintiffs to File Motion for Attorneys' Fees, Costs, and Incentive Awards	No later than 7 days after the Objection Deadline.
Plaintiffs to File Motion for Final Approval, Proof of Notice and Response to Objections	No later than 7 days after the Objection Deadline
Final Approval and Fairness Hearing	September 28, 2026 or another date approved by the Court
Defendants Second Payment to QSF for Attorneys' Fees, Service Awards and Administration Costs	Within 30 days of the Final Approval Order
Deadline for Class Members to Submit Claims Forms	9 months after Notice Date
Defendants Third and Final Payment to QSF for Distribution of Settlement Proceeds to Class Members With Valid Claims Submissions	30 days after the deadline for claims expires and final payment amount is determined by Epiq, or 30 days after the Final Approval Order becomes final, whichever is later
